

Are You Eligible?

To qualify for cost share you must meet the following requirements:

• Land where the BMP is to be installed/used must be located within the <u>priority area</u>:

Upper Wabash River (See map to the right)

- If you do not own the land, you must have landowner permission and signature for the application
- The date of purchase/installation must be AFTER the date of application <u>approval</u>

How to Apply

- Fill out the 319A cost share form
- 3. Fill out the W-9 Taxpayer Identification form
- Return forms to your local SWCD office, who will send them to the Huntington SWCD office
- Applications will be evaluated using procedures outlined by the steering committee
- 6. Do not start any work on the project until you have been notified of program acceptance
