

Water quality monitoring program

The water quality monitoring program provides continual assessment and review of water quality throughout the Lower Salamonie River Watershed. Water sampling takes place six times a year from March to November at thirteen sites and includes parameters such as nitrate-nitrite, total phosphorous, turbidity, dissolved oxygen (DO), *E. coli*, and pH. Habitat and macroinvertebrate assessments are also conducted once a year between July and October.

Education and outreach program

The education and outreach program is designed to inform and educate local stakeholders about water quality concerns, such as nonpoint source (NPS) pollution. Another goal of the education and outreach program is to foster stewardship from members of the surrounding communities. The program includes workshops, field days, informational public meetings, as well as other community events such as river cleanups
